Trip Highlights

Board a "curiara"(Indian canoe) and see to the falls of the Canaima lagoon, cross the Sapo Fall by foot to arrive to the Mayupa Savannah and see the magnificent Auyantepuy. Trek to the impressive Angel Fall, the world's highest waterfall. Take an excursion to see the wildlife in Los Llanos: 250 species of birds, nearly 50 species of mammals and over 40 species of reptiles. Go to the Sierra Nevada and the Sierra de la Culata in the Venezuelan Andean region and see the tallest peaks. Visit the Andean Condor Station and the Laguna Mucubaji Park (3800 m.). Head to Lake Maracaibo for a bird and butterfly watching expedition and watch the mysterious Catatumbo lightning. Spent time lying on a white sandy beach, relaxing at a key of Los Roques National Park.

Destinations Visited

In this tour you will visit the following destination

Caracas

Caracas, Venezuela's capital, has over four centuries of history buried beneath its urban city. Simón Bolívar described Caracas as: "si se opone la naturaleza lucharemos contra ella y la haremos que nos obedezca" (if nature opposes us, we'll struggle against her until she obeys us). Caracas is the place where you can see the legacy of Bolívar's defiant proclamation. It sits in the Cerro Avila Valley, where mountain ranges soar 8000 feet from the Caribbean. Once inhabited by Toromaimo Indians, the city was founded by the Spanish in 1567. In Caracas you find an array of cultural activity, world-class museums or eclectic cuisine, from the arepa joints of Sabana Grande to the haute cuisine of hubs like Las Mercedes and Los Palos Grandes. Nightlife is also one of the best in the country. Things not to miss include: La Plaza Bolívar, La Casa Natal de Simon Bolívar, Centro de Arte La Estancia, El Hatillo, Museo de Arte Contemporáneo de Caracas, Catedral, and Iglesia San Francisco.



Canaima National Park/Angel Falls

Travel with Turpial Travel to one of the largest national parks in the world and the second largest in Venezuela. Canaima National Park astonishes visitors with the drama of its spectacular landscapes and biological diversity. Its signature landmarks are the tepuis, unique rock formations that rise up out of the surroundings to create huge ecological islands (the most famous, Roraima, inspired Conan Doyle's novel, The Lost World) punctured by waterfalls, including Angel Falls, the planet's highest. In 1994, UNESCO declared Canaima National Park a World Heritage Site. The organization calls the park a "unique biogeological entity". It is best to visit Canaima National Park and the famous Angel Falls during the rainy season (from May to November) as dry season the rivers can run almost completely dry.



Puerto Ordaz/Ciudad Guayana

Puerto Ordaz today one of the cities with highest rate of industrial and economic growth is also one of the best planned and most modern ones in the country. Founded in 1952, as the headquarters of the Orinoco Mining Company, this city lodges the iron and aluminum industry which in Venezuela, is second only to the oil industry. From here these nowadays so vital natural resources are supplied to the worldwide market. The union of San Felix and the industrial sector of this city gave birth to Ciudad Guayana in 1961. Ciudad Guayana is the home of The Guri dam, the second biggest hydroelectric power station in the world, which supplies the energy to the electric industry both local and national. In this city the two most important rivers of the country join, creating the Caronoco Zone, named after the two rivers' names Caroni and Orinoco. From one of the bridges that links Puerto Ordaz and San Felix this confluence is perfectly visible. Among the loveliest attractions of the city are Cachamay and La Llovizna Parks, where you can admire superb cascades and relish the luscious flora on the parks beautiful paths. "A close natural encounter of the best kind".

Los Llanos

Los Llanos (flat plains), is considered one of the ecosystems with the most important wetlands in the world! Los Llanos changes dramatically according to the season, from a dry expanse of ranchland in the winter to a vast shallow lake in the summer. These vast plains shelter hundreds of bird species (over 300) and more than 50 mammals, promising encounters with amazing animals like the Anaconda, Jaguar, Puma, Jaguarondi, Ocelots, Grey Fox, Pink River Dolphin, Giant Anteater, Orinoco Crocodile, among many others! After your wildlife safari ,party with "Llaneros" under a blanket of stars. Llaneros are the hard-working cowboys of Venezuela, famous for the joropos music they play on the cuatro (a tiny four-stringed guitar), the arpa (harp) and maracas, capturing the heart of Venezuelan culture. It's is also one of the best places in Venezuela for rafting. In the Llanos (Plains), the rainy season (June-October) is perfect for rafting but the dry season (November-May) is best for safari excursions, when the low lagoons attract a huge diversity of exuberant wildlife.



Merida & the Andes

Our programs in Mérida, encompass a wide variety of activities, from extreme sports to bird watching. The local people will be your hosts and your guides through this breathtaking destination. Bound by the Sierra Nevada and the Sierra de la Culata, the Venezuelan Andean region offers unparalleled biodiversity as well as Venezuela's tallest peaks. Its main city, Mérida, boasts the highest and longest cable car in the world. Meet the people, explore the mountain paths, experience the unique Páramo ecosystem. The Andes offer a whole range of options for adventurers and nature lovers. With Venezuela's highest mountains (Bolívar, Humboldt, La Concha, Bomplandt and León) and the páramo, Mérida has to be top of your list for mountain climbing, trekking and hiking.



Maracaibo Lake Region

The Maracaibo Lake region is one of the least known to ecotourists. With an amazing variety of landscapes, human cultures, and unique flora and fauna, it is a promising destination for those who are in search of the exotic and the new. It was at Lake Maracaibo that Christopher Columbus found the inspiration for the country's name: the locals' houses on stilts above the water evoked a "mazing variety of landscapes" which is what Venezuela means. There are still houses on stilts on the lake. The major attraction for most visitors is the spectacular but still mysterious Catatumbo lightning, which Spanish chroniclers described it in the late 16th century as the "strange lightning that happens every night in the southern part of Lake Maracaibo". This region is so dramatically different from the nearby Andes Mountains that it gives you the feeling of being in two countries at the same time. From the cloud forest of the Sierra Nevada de Mérida to the desert canyon of Chama River, and from the coffee farms and sugarcane factories to the houses-on-stilts and freshwater dolphins, Lake Maracaibo is a fascinating destination.



Los Roques National Park

Los Roques National Park is made up of approximately 50 keys. Its climate has an average year round temperature of 28.8 °C (82 °F). Although the keys share the same general characteristics such as very white sand surrounded by a sea of different shades, from turquoise green to deep blue, and the typical prairie vegetation where the brown tones are predominant as well as the intense green of the mangrove; each one is very different. Cayo Muerto is one of those islands. On the other hand, there are islands you may enjoy deserted beaches surrounded by leafy mangroves (Cayo Remanso). What makes this archipelago so special is that it gives the tourist the possibility of choosing the most attractive key of your choice everyday. For those who do not wish to spend their vacation lying on the beach, Los Roques offers sporting activities such as snorkeling, diving, canoeing, kayaking, bonefish and deepwater fishing, windsurfing and ultra light aircraft flights over the archipelago.



Trip Itinerary

Day 1: Caracas

Meet a Turpial Travel assistant at the Maiquetía airport in Caracas and he/she will welcome you to Venezuela, answer all your questions, and transfer you to your hotel. Overnight at a hotel.



Day 2: Canaima National Park/Angel Falls - Caracas - Puerto Ordaz/Ciudad Guayana



Take the first flight to Puerto Ordaz. Upon arrival take a connecting flight to Canaima National Park. In Canaima you will be transferred to our main camp. At 2:00 p.m. leave the camp and head to the "Ucaima" port situated above the "Canaima Lagoon Falls. Board a "curiara" (Indian canoe) and travel through the Canaima Lagoon. When you arrive at "Sapo Fall" - a magnificent water fall of approximately 45 meters in height and

100 meters in width - prepare yourself to cross it by foot! At the other side of the fall, a jeep will be waiting for you to take you through the "Mayupa Sabana". Observe the "Mayupa Rapids" and part of the magnificent "Auyan Tepuy". After crossing the Sabana by jeep, board the curiara once more and travel through the "Carrao" river to the "Happy Well". During the voyage, observe the lush tropical vegetation, Palmas de Moriche (a tropical palms) and Tepuyes. At the Happy Well, the group will stop to take a refreshing bath before continuing the journey to the "Ahonda Camp" in front of the "Orchid Island" (a shelter of red stones) where we will have dinner with a view of the "Auyan Tepuy". Spend the night sleeping in hammocks with mosquito nettings and blankets.

Note: Sleeping near the Angel Falls in a hammock excursion can only be done during the rainy season (June - November). If you are visiting Venezuela during the dry season you will have to sleep at the lodge for two nights and go up and down the river to see the fall the same day OR do an overflight depending on how low the water levels when you are there.

Day 3: Canaima N. P. & Angel Falls

After breakfast, board the curiara and travel up river to "Isla Raton". At Isla Raton, trek an hour to the base of the magnificent Angel Fall. Enjoy the splendid view of the fall and if time permits, swim in the Angel Fall lagoon. Return to the "Orchid Island" for lunch and after that head back to the main camp (arriving there at 6:00 p.m. approximately). Overnight at a camp.



Day 4: Canaima National Park/Angel Falls - Los Llanos - Caracas - Puerto Ordaz/Ciudad Guayana



After breakfast fly to Barinas. Upon arrival, you will be Overnight at a ranch.

Day 5: Los Llanos

Early transfer to a ranch in Los Llanos (approx. a 3-4 hour drive). Spend the afternoon taking an excursion to observe wildlife at its best! The ranch hosts over 250 species of birds, nearly 50 species of mammals (including jaguars, pumas, ocelots, white-tailed deer, crab-eating foxes, capybaras, red howler and capuchin monkeys, opossums, ant-eaters, armadillos and river dolphins), and over 40 species of reptiles (including spectacled caimans, green iguanas, anacondas, turtles and red-footed tortoises). Overnight at a ranch.



Day 6: Los Llanos



Spend another day taking an excursion to observe wildlife at the ranch. Overnight at a ranch.

Day 7: Los Llanos - Mérida

Take a last wildlife excursion at the ranch. After lunch, you will be transferred to Santo Domingo. On the way you will get to see the beauty of the Andean Region - bound by the Sierra Nevada and the Sierra de la Culata, the Venezuelan Andean region has unparalleled biodiversity and Venezuela's tallest peaks. Overnight at an ex-monastery.



Day 8: Mérida



On the way to Merida, travel through the Andean Paramo. The paramo is a high-altitude region with a neotropical ecosystem. It is located between the upper forest line (about 3800 m altitude) and the permanent snow line (about 5000 m). The ecosystem consists of accident, mostly glacier formed valleys and plains with a large variety of lakes, peat bogs and wet grasslands intermingled with shrublands and forest patches. This neotropical

ecosystem hosts about 5000 different plant species where 60% of these species are endemic, adapted to the specific climate characteristics of the place. Vegetation you will get to see in this trip are: tussock grasses, ground rosettes, dwarf shrubs cushion plants and conspicuous giant rosettes such as Espeletia (frilejon) and Puya (in the family Bromeliaceae). The paramo covers 2600 Km² of the state!

In addition, visit colonial Andean villages and enjoy the drinks and cuisine they have to offer. We will drive up the Pico Aguila (4,125-m), the highest point in Venezuela. Visit the Andean Condor Station and the Laguna Mucubaji Park (3,800-m) located in the Sierra Nevada. In this lake you will be able to see the yellows flowers of frailejones - a plant only seen in the Andean regions. Next, walk or take a horseback ride to Laguna Negra (optional), where you will enter into a microclimate that due to its special ecosystem receives more rain and humidity than the surrounding Paramo area. This extra humidity gives life to an interesting diversity of plant species, adding color and greenery to the wind-swept Paramo region. Laguna Negra is a beautiful site on a clear, calm day. The black water forms such a perfect mirror that it disappears and is replaced by the reflection of the trees on the mountainside. Overnight at a posada. NOTE: THE LAGUNA NEGRA EXCURSION IS NOT INCLUDED IN YOUR PACKAGE. THEY CAN BE ARRANGED AT AN ADDITIONAL COST.


Day 9: Mérida

Early in the morning, grab your jacket and get ready for an adventure. Visit the world's longest and highest cable car that takes you from the Barinitas station (1577 meters) to Mirror Peak (Pico Espejo) at an altitude of 4,765 meters above sea level! From the cable car enjoy panoramic views of the beautiful city of Mérida, enclosed between mountains and peaks covered with snow. As you ascend in the cable car you will see detailed landscapes of Sierra La Culata, the Chama valley river, and the majestic Bolivar's Peak (Pico Bolivar).



NOTE: If the cable car is not operating when you are there, this section of the trip will be changed for a tour of the city of Mérida. Overnight at a posada.

Day 10: Maracaibo Lake Region - Merida



Leave Mérida in the morning and head to Lake Maracaibo for a bird and butterfly watching expedition. In the evening, take a night safari and watch the Catatumbo lightning - a mysterious semi-permanent lightning storm that occurs where the Catatumbo River meets Lake Maracaibo. The frequent, powerful flashes of lightning over this relatively small area are considered by some to be the world's largest single generator of

tropospheric ozone. It occurs over and around Lake Maracaibo, typically over a bog area that forms where the Catatumbo River flows into the Venezuelan lake. Overnight in Palafitos (sleep in hammocks).

Day 11: Mérida - Maracaibo Lake Region

Continue to enjoy the landscape and wildlife of the Maracaibo region. After lunch, drive back to Merida City. Overnight at a posada.



Day 12: Merida & the Andes - Caracas



Transfer to el Vigia airport. Fly to Caracas. Transfer to your hotel. Overnight in a hotel in downtown Caracas.

Day 13: Los Roques National Park - Caracas

Transfer to the airport. Fly to Los Roques National Park. At the main island, there will be a travel assistant waiting for you. He/she will take you to your posada (guest house). Check-in and head to the beach. Overnight at an all inclusive posada.



Day 14: Los Roques N. P.



Another day spent on a white sandy beach, reading a book or just relaxing at a key. Overnight at a posada.

NOTE: Excursions are not included in your package.

Day 15: Los Roques National Park - Caracas

Fly back to Caracas. Upon arrival our travel assistant will be waiting for you to transfer you to your hotel. Overnight at a hotel.



Day 16: Caracas



Transfer to the Caracas airport. END OF SERVICES

Terms & Conditions

All persons wishing to make a booking have carefully read and understand the Terms and Conditions that follow. By making a booking by telephone, email, or on the website www.turpialtravel.com with Turpial Travel & Adventure (also known as AUTANA LLC) or its Agents, you accept on behalf of yourself and all those named on the booking including minors and person under a disability to be bound by these Terms and Conditions. A booking is accepted and becomes definite only from the date the client processed the payment and a confirmation invoice and/or email was sent. It is at this point that a contract between Turpial Travel & Adventure and the client comes into effect. These conditions apply to the exclusion of any other terms and conditions unless agreed to in writing by the parties prior to the trip departure. Previous dealings between the parties will not vary these conditions. No purported variations of these conditions will be effective unless in writing and signed by a person so authorized by Turpial Travel & Adventure.

1. How to Book

To reserve your place on a tour, you should complete the booking form, together with a non-refundable deposit of 30% per person of the total amount to your travel agent.

2. Payments

The prices quoted in this tour are for payments in cash, bank transfer, or credit card. The balance of the tour price is payable to Turpial Travel & Adventure *30 days prior to departure*. If the trip is a last minute booking, payment deadline

will be sent when Turpial Travel & Adventure and its clients confirm the booking. Prices are quoted in US dollars and all payments must be made in US dollars, unless agreed otherwise by Turpial Travel & Adventure.

After the full payment has been received and processed, you will receive detailed pre-departure information package which will include your final itinerary, what we recommend bringing, final invoice, and other important information needed to prepare for the trip. Final trip details will be sent to you two weeks prior to your departure unless you request the pre-departure information sooner.

3. Amendments, Transfers & Cancellations

Amendments: If you wish to make amendments to your travel arrangements, you must notify Turpial Travel & Adventure in writing. Each amendment to your tour arrangement will incur a \$150 administration fee per booking, per person, in addition to the cost of any extra services required. The client must also understand and accept that Turpial Travel & Adventure may not be able to accommodate or guarantee new requests. All administration fees must be paid prior to departure.

Transfers: If you wish to transfer from one tour to another and/or change your destination, you must notify Turpial Travel & Adventure in writing. Once Turpial Travel & Adventure receives your notice the transfer will take place subject to the following charges:

- If your notice is received more than 30 days prior to original departure date, a \$150 fee will apply. In addition, any increase in airfare or operational services will be payable by you.
- If your notice is received within 30 days prior the original departure date, 50% of your original tour price will be forfeited provided your notice is received 15 days prior to your original departure date, otherwise 100% of your tour price will be forfeited.
- If you cannot travel for a reason such as illness, injury, or death, Turpial Travel & Adventure will agree to transfer the booking to another person provided it receives a written request at least 30 days prior to departure. The client must pay a US\$150 administrative fee, pay any penalties charged by suppliers, and understand that airlines may impose a 100% cancellation fee and charge a different rate for new tickets.
- Any requested amendment to tour arrangements or transfer from one tour to another is subject to availability and the agreement in writing of Turpial Travel & Adventure.

In the event of any change, modification, cancellation postponement or delay under this condition, you acknowledge that you will have no right of refund of the tour price (whether in whole or in part) and no right to claim compensation of any injury, loss or damage or other additional expenses incurred by virtue of the change, modification, cancellation postponement or delay. Turpial Travel & Adventure also reserves, in its absolute discretion, the right to cancel any tour due to any government travel warning or advice, or any change in such warning or advice. In this event condition 3 applies in respect of the cancellation or transfer of a tour. Travel insurance may compensate you depending on the circumstances.

5. Airline

Any airline tickets issued are subject to the carrier's refund policy. Turpial Travel & Adventure is not liable for any penalty charges associated with non-refundable air fares, even if caused by a change of tour departure times, dates or airports.

6. Insurance

Insurance is mandatory for all our clients. Personal travel insurance is not included in the tour price. It is a format condition of booking a tour with Turpial Travel & Adventure that you are adequately insured for the full duration of the tour in respect to emergency evacuation, illness, injury, death, loss of baggage and personal items and cancellation and curtailment. Personal belongings lost or stolen while unattended by the client in public lounges or other public areas, whether on board a vessel, train, bus, or other mode of transportation, publicly owned or operated by the Company or elsewhere, are not reimbursable. Losses due to ordinary wear and tear, and other acts of God are not reimbursable. Turpial Travel & Adventure cannot accept responsibility for and in no event shall be liable for loss or damage of valuables or other articles left in or on facilities used by the Company such as hotels, homestays, vessels, expedition vehicles, or any other mode of transportation. The client acknowledges that the cost of the tour does not include insurance, and that the client is required to obtain separate coverage at an additional cost. When obtaining travel insurance the client must ensure the insurer is aware of the type of travel to be undertaken.

7. Medical Disclosure

You declare and warrant that:

- You are in good health and mental and physical fitness at the time of booking this tour;
- You have disclosed to Turpial Travel & Adventure every matter concerning your health and mental and physical fitness of which you are aware, or ought reasonably expected to know, that this relevant to Turpial Travel & Adventure decision to permit you to go on this adventure tour.
- Immediately upon any adverse change in your health or fitness that may be likely to affect Turpial Travel & Adventure's decision to accept the risk of permitting you to go on the adventure tour, you will notify Turpial Travel & Adventure in writing of any such adverse change.

You acknowledge that the obligation to disclose under the condition continues from the time of booking the tour through the departure and extends for the duration of the tour. If you fail to comply with the duty of disclosure in this condition and if Turpial Travel & Adventure would not have permitted you to undertake this tour, or continue participation on the tour, had you made full disclosure under this condition, Turpial Travel & Adventure will not be liable, except to the minimum extent required by law, for personal injury, death and property damage and loss incurred by you.

8. Groups and Families

The client signing the contract with Turpial Travel & Adventure has the authority to do so on behalf all the persons named in the booking form, and confirms that they are fully aware of the booking being made on their behalf and that they accept these terms and conditions.

9. Tour Prices

Turpial Travel & Adventure reserves the right to amend tour prices (or any part) without notice at any time before and including the departure date. Amendments may be necessitated for many reasons including but not limited to: exchange rate fluctuations, increased fuel costs, airfares, airport charges, increases in ground operator service fees, and/or the need to engage alternative air or ground operations. Any increase in tour prices must be paid prior to departure date.

10. Exclusions from Tour Price

The following items are excluded from the tour price:

- Personal travel insurance.
- Visa, passport and vaccination charges.
- Departure, airport and airline taxes.
- Extra emails, transport costs, accommodation costs, or other expenses not included in the itinerary.
- Laundry, postage, personal clothing, medical expenses and items of personal nature.
- Emergency evacuation and/or emergency search charges.
- Tips and excess baggage charges.
- Meals referenced in the itinerary that were not given due to force majeure and/or outside activities that did not allow you to be there on time.

If you wish to unsubscribe from our mailing list please inform us of this via our contact page and we will remove your details from our system. We will not provide your details to any other organization or use our mailing list to promote products and services from anybody else.

Data Protection Policy: Turpial Travel & Adventure is committed to handling personal data in the spirit of the Data Protection Act 1998 ("the Act") and protecting personal privacy in accordance with the law.

Confidentiality: Please note that we do not sell, rent, or trade your details to any third parties. Only employees of Turpial Travel & Adventure are granted access to your details. However, we may need to release or transfer data in a few, special circumstances, when a) We respond to court orders, or legal process, or to establish or exercise our legal rights or defend against legal claims b) We believe it is necessary to share information in order to investigate, prevent, or take action regarding illegal activities, spamming, suspected fraud, situations involving potential threats to the physical safety of any person, violations of our terms of service, or as otherwise required by law c) We must transfer the information, to a successor company in the event of a sale, merger, liquidation, dissolution, reorganization or acquisition of Turpial Travel & Adventure.

12. Force Majeure

If Turpial Travel & Adventure is prevented (directly or indirectly) from performing any of its obligations under the agreement by reason of act of God such as strikes, trade disputes, fire, breakdowns, interruption of transportation, government or political action, acts of war or terrorism, acts or omissions of a third party or for any other cause whatsoever outside Turpial Travel & Adventure's reasonable control, Turpial Travel & Adventure will be under no liability whatsoever to you and may, at its option, by written notice to you either cancel the tour or take any other action as specified in condition 4.

13. Assumption of Risk

You acknowledge that:

- By the very nature of the adventure holidays, they are more challenging and demanding with a commensurately higher level of risk compared with conventional holidays; and
- In the regions in which adventure travel is undertaken, standards of accommodation, transport, health care, hygiene, safety and service precision generally are often not as high as those standards in your country of residence and may require flexibility and patience on your part; and
- Operational control of the tour may be in the hands of a third party and that performance is against the third party and not against Turpial Travel & Adventure;

- Will not be liable for any breach of any law by any person with whom you travel on the tour; and
- You may not rely on any representations concerning the tour made by Turpial Travel & Adventure which are not contained in these conditions.

15. Release and Waiver of Liability

As this is a voluntary trip, in consideration of Turpial Travel & Adventure accepting your booking application and in consideration of you being permitted by Turpial Travel & Adventure to join the tour:

- You release Turpial Travel & Adventure and its officers, employees, agents, licensees, guides and other representatives and the land management authorities in the country in which the tour is conducted (each of whom are collectively referred to as "Turpial Travel Team") from all cost, liability, loss or damage incurred or suffered by you directly or

indirectly during the course of the tour and resulting from your personal injury, illness or death or damage to or loss of your property unless caused by the willful negligence of wrongful act of Turpial Travel & Adventure and its employees; and

- You waive any claims you have, or may at the time have, against Turpial Travel & Adventure and its employees and you agree, by accepting the additional inherent dangers and risks associated with the tour, not to make any claim against or seek any compensation from Turpial Travel & Adventure and its employees in respect of any personal injury, illness or death suffered by you or damage or loss of property sustained by you as a result of your participation in the tour.

16. Jurisdiction & Dispute Resolution

You agree that any dispute concerning, relating or referring to this contract, the brochure, or any other literature concerning my trip, or the trip itself shall be resolved exclusively by binding arbitration in Denver, Colorado, according to the then existing commercial rules of the American Arbitration Association. Such proceeding will be governed by substantive Denver law without regard to the Denver Arbitration Act. The arbitrator(s) and not any federal, state, or local court or agency shall have exclusive authority to resolve any dispute relating to the interpretation, applicability, enforceability, conscionability, or formation of this contract, including but not limited to any claim that all or any part of this contract is void or voidable.
